The death of Richard Preston Coker, long time resident of Morgan county and veteran of the Civil war, took place at his home Tuesday afternoon at 12:20 o'clock, after an extended illness.

Mr. Coker was born on May 9, 1839, a son of Clabon and Elizabeth Coker, near Pisgah. He was united in marriage with Miss Eva Taylor on May 12, 1879. Mrs. Coker and two step-daughters, Mrs. Malo Gopalies, Springfield and Mrs. Ella Melvin, St. Petersburg, Fla., survive. He also leaves one brother, James Coker, Republic, Mo.

Mr. Coker was a member of Matt Starr post G. A. R., of this city.
