They had five other children:Lydia Matilda, b. 1881 George Fancis, b. 1884, Robert Jesse, b. 1886, Flora Edith, b. 1888, Sanford Sanco, born 1891 and Hugh Ellis, born 1895.

In 1900 census, they lived in Nortonville Twp, Morgan Co., IL. They had been married 31 years and had 11 children, all still living.

He applied for pension May 1 1890 from IL. His wife, Rhoda, applied for pension May 9 1917.

He was born 8 Oct 1842. He died Apr 10 1917 at Murrayville, IL(from pension records and death certificate. His tombstone says 1919.) It also has his unit as Cc. M 73 IL Inf(no such unit.) He is buried in Youngblood Cemetery in Nortonville, Morgan Co., IL. His wife and son Hugh are also buried there.
