DEATH OF HENRY GINTER LEAVES ONLY ONE MEMBER OF WILLIAM A. WEBB POST (in Peotone)

Henry Ginter, civil war veteran and the last but one surviving member of William A. Webb Post, G.A.R., passed away at the home of his daughter, Mrs. John A. Dopp, at Forest Grove, Oregon, on Thursday June 30, 1927.

Mr. Ginter was one of Peotone's best known citizens from the 60's until two years ago when he moved to Oregon to pass his declinng years He was 83 years old. He had been in failing health for several months.

Mr. Ginter enlisted in the service of his country in Company I, 101st Illinois Infantry on July 28, 1862, and served until June 20, 1865. Shortly afterward he settled on a farm three miles north of Peotone where he resided for many years before retiring and moving into the village.

Besides his widow, the deceased leaves two sons, Dr. A.E. Genter, Sheboygan, Wis., and Wallace Ginter, Glidden, Iowa, and two daughters, Mrs. John A. Dopp, Forest Grove, Oregon, and Mrs. F.W. Erickson, Valparaiso, Ind. There are seven grandchildren and five great grandchildren.

Funeral services were held from the Dopp home of Forest Grove Saturday afternoon. Burial was in the Forest Grove cemetery.

With the death of Mr. Ginter William A. Webb Post, No. 657, Grand Army of the Republic is left with only one name on its list of members. Henry Westenfeld, of Beecher is the last surviving

member. Not many years ago it was an active organization with a membership of over thirty. One by one the old boys have answered taps and when the last is gone the once mighty host of civil war veterans will live only in the memory of a part of the present generation.

Death of Mrs. Harriet Ginter

Mrs. Harriet Ginter passed away Wednesday, October 19, at the home of her daughter, Mrs. John A. Dopp of Forest Grove, Oregon.

Mrs. Ginter's maiden name was Harriet Rowan and she spent her early years with an aunt near Jacksonville, her parents having died when she was an infant. She was 86 years old the 19th day of last March.

Mrs. Ginter was a woman of culture and refinement and transmitted to her children ambition and a desire for intellectual advancement.

Services were held Saturday at the funeral home in Forest Grove and burial was in Forest Grove cemetery.
